



### Health Policy & Your Health



- Ontario has the lowest public health care funding per person in Canada
- Healthcare budget increases are not keeping up with inflation
- ► The health care budget is not being spent in full
- Public money is flowing into privatizing public hospital services

### Health Policy & Your Health




- Despite a healthcare worker crisis, the current government passed Bill 124 in 2019 capping wage increases for public health and other public sector workers – struck down as unconstitutional by the Courts
- ► The health care wage cap was imposed only on public sector health workers while for-profits were not capped

### Health Privatization & Your Health



- A record number of healthcare privatization lobbyists have been registered under this government
- Operating funding for public hospitals increased only 0.5% last year
- One of the only two for-profit Ontario hospitals (Clearpoint Don Mills Surgical), received a 278% funding increase with the former Minister of Health acting as lobbyist after exiting the Ministry
- ► This government has not curbed for profit staffing agencies charging up to triple the price for exactly the same staff employed in the public system

### The Bottom Line on Health Privatization



- Privatisation reduces the quality of health care and worsens health outcomes
- "the best evidence we currently have ... probably...the best evidence we are ever able to collect." [REF: Lancet Public Health 2024]
- ► CMA Policy 2024: "strongly supports a publicly funded health care system where ... care is based on patients' needs and not on their ability to pay"

- Ontario had the lowest number of hospital beds per capita in Canada in 2022
- Projected shortfall of 13,800 hospital beds & over 80,000 staff by 2032
  [REF: Ontario Council of Hospital Unions]
- Despite 2018 campaign promise to end hallway health care, the numbers doubled between 2018 to 2024
- The vast majority of Ontario's hospitals are now in deficit [REF: OHC Feb21/24 report]
- Unprecedented closures of over 1200 vital services including local ER's, ICUs & labs in 2023
- The number of Ontarians without a family doctor skyrocketed from 1.8 million in 2020 to 2.5 million now and is projected to rise to a staggering 4.4 million by 2026 [Ref: OMA]




### Health harms occur by 2 interconnected pathways when fossil fuels are burned






### Air pollution Related Deaths & Health Costs


Premature deaths globally due to air pollution: 8.1 million in 2021 [Ref: Unicef 2024]




15 300 premature Canadian deaths annually 6700 Ontario deaths annually



### Climate Change & Air Pollution Harm Mental Health

- Anxiety
- Depression
- Stress
- Suicide
- Disproportionately affect youth



### Energy Policy & Health

- Any fossil fuel based energy policy such as gas is expensive & harmful to human health
- Nuclear energy is the most expensive energy option & too slow to meet urgent energy needs
- Canada to date has NO permanent solution for decades of accumulated radioactive nuclear waste with experts deeply concerned with health risks of Chalk River disposal and DGRs (deep geological repositories)

## Housing Policy & Health: Housing is Fundamental to Health



- ▶ Under the current government homelessness increased 25% over past 2 years to hit record highs (80,000 in 2024 – with 1400 encampments) [Ref: AMO 2025]
- ► Auditor General 2021: "Ministry does not have an overarching strategy ... for the reduction of homelessness"
  - ► Lack of affordable housing is worsening homelessness in Ontario
  - ▶ Communicable diseases escalate
  - ▶ Increased usage of fire, paramedic, emergency room services

- Under the current government, new housing starts are at a 69 year low [Ref: FAO]
- The "More Homes Built Faster Act" not only tried to build over the Greenbelt which was pushed back, but also undermined affordable housing & renters' rights in many ways that were not reversed
- Supportive housing: \$500/month Hospital bed: \$12,000/month Prisoner > \$9,000/month [Ref: Parliamentary Budget Officer]
- Permanent housing for up to 3,000 emergency shelters users could save
   \$60 million/year [City of Toronto, 2020 cost analysis]

### Food Security & Health: Food is fundamental to health

- ▶ Foodbank use is at record highs (25% increase since 2023)
- Main drivers:
  - ▶ Unaffordable housing & cost of living
  - ▶ Precarious employment
  - ► Failing government support programs

## Food Security & Health: Food is fundamental to health

- Poor climate policy driving the climate crisis & current land use policies destroying over 300 acres of farmland every day disrupt Ontario farmers' ability to grow food
- ► This increases food insecurity, harming Ontarians' health
- ► This also damages our food independence to Grow Local Eat Local with the threat of US tariffs
